1. The naïve painter was the American Friend Edward Hicks (1780-1849). The motive to which he frequently returned was *The Peaceable Kingdom*.
2. The York-born artist was Henry Scott Tuke (1858-1929), and the collection of his work is at Falmouth Art Gallery.
3. The talented Black member of Philadelphia Meeting was Sarah Mapps Douglass (1806-1882).
4. The couple in question was Nelson Dawson (1859-1941) and Edith Dawson (1862 -1928), who were active in the Arts and Crafts movement.
5. Ben Arnup is the York ceramicist and member of Friargate Meeting.
6. The project was the Quaker Tapestry, and the extract shows Mary Fisher visiting the Ottoman Sultan in 1657.
7. J Doyle Penrose (1862-1932) painted the *The Presence in the Midst*, depicting a meeting for worship.
8. Elizabeth Fry (1780 -1845) is shown in the silhouette.
9. The Danish-born Friend Elisabeth Holmgaard was the talented designer and weaver.
10. The artist in question was Samuel Lucas (1805-1870), who painted scenes in Hitchin.
